

CMF to file charges against five applications offering loans for alleged usury

- They are available for download from Google Play and other websites.

December 31, 2025 — The Financial Market Commission (CMF) alerts the public about five applications that are not supervised by the CMF and offer predatory loans.

The Commission filed a criminal complaint before the Public Prosecutor's Office against all parties responsible for the following applications, which are available for download from Google Play and other websites:

1. APP YAPI CASH.
2. APP SABA PRESTAMO SEGURO.
3. APP TIROFACIL-PRÉSTAMO.
4. APP SENCI PLATA-PRÉSTAMO URGENTE.
5. APP CAPITAL HOY-PRÉSTAMO RÁPIDO.
